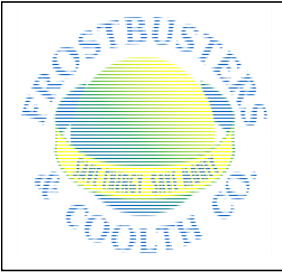


Energy Efficiency & Energy Star Certifications – Fritz Diether

Warner's Corner



This Friday, October 16, another revered member of the Rotary Club of Grand Junction - William Moyer - will be honored with the unveiling of his statue as part of the Legend's Sculpture Project. The ceremony will be in front of the downtown Alpine Bank building at 5:30 p.m.

Moyer's tribute is the second of the "5 in 5" (five sculptures in five years) series. One of our club's founders, Walter Walker, was the first "legend" to be so honored last year.

Any Rotarian would be very proud of the many contributions Moyer made to this community and he left a lasting legacy. For more than 40 years, "Moyer's Fair Store" was the leading mercantile store in Western Colorado. His generosity was truly legendary.

Among other things, he contributed to the Grand Valley National Bank, Douglas Pass and Unawep roads, and he funded college scholarships. He and his wife also donated the city's first public swimming pool - the \$25,000 Moyer Natatorium (now the Lincoln Park Moyer Pool) - in June of 1922. They stipulated there be two "free days" a week so no child had to risk drowning in the Colorado or Gunnison rivers, a real concern in those days.

Our club, by virtue of being a project sponsor for last year's Walter Walker statue (see front cover), will be listed on the plaque for this sculpture and all succeeding statues.

On The Beat:

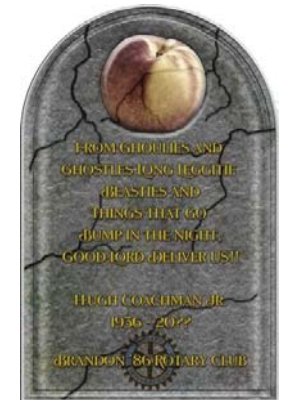
